

#### A Variety of Programs to Meet Your Needs

#### Junior Middle School (Grades 7 and 8)

- Students with at least primary 6 are eligible to apply to Junior Middle School (JMS)
- Offers special custodianship services to young students

#### High School (Grades 9-12)

- Students with at least Form 2/ Sec. 1/ Junior Middle 2 are eligible to apply
- Graduates are awarded the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- Offers co-op placements for students to explore potential careers

#### **Pre-University Program**


- Prepares students for admission to universities in Canada, USA, Australia, New Zealand, and the U.K
- Students now studying in Form 5, Sec. 4, 'O' Level, are eligible to apply to the 6-month program (January or Mid-May intake); allows the completion of 6 credits
- Senior Middle 2 students are eligible to apply for a minimum 10-month program (August intake); allows students to complete 8 credits and graduate with an OSSD





Columbia's exclusive Personalized Success Plan (PSP) ensures students maintain a healthy balance between their studies and extracurricular activities.

Using the ASEP assessment scores, our guidance counsellors design a PSP for each student by taking into consideration their academic responsibilities, as well as their need for relaxation and social interaction. Throughout the semester, this team continues to review and adjust students' PSP and guides them on:

- Number of courses to take each semester
- Duration of time to complete their academic program
- Selection of courses to meet their personal interests and career goals
- Their performance in each course

#### All awards and scholarships are given by Columbia International College. To qualify, all credits must be taken within 12 consecutive months.

#### Principal's Scholarship

Three scholarships of \$3,000 awarded in May and December to the top 4U graduate with at least 85% average in the best six credits, and with at least 80% in 4U English.

#### Governor General's Medal

This is awarded each academic calendar year (from June to May) to the graduating student with the highest academic average in the best six 4U courses completed in that year. Student receives a medal from the Governor General of Canada.

#### Lieutenant Governor's Volunteer Award

The award recognizes an exemplary volunteer among the graduating students. It pays tribute to those students who not only complete the number of volunteer hours required to graduate, but who go above and beyond.

#### **Ontario Scholars**

Graduating students who obtain an average of 80% in six 4U credits may be designated as Ontario Scholars. These students receive an Ontario Scholar Certificate and a letter of congratulations from the Ontario Ministry of Education.

#### ScarfoneHawkins LLP English Proficiency

Three scholarships of \$500 presented annually in May, June, and December to the student chosen by the English Department to be most improved in a senior English course.

#### Harold Mills Memorial Scholarship

In memory of Mr. Harold Mills, Principal of Columbia International College from 1984-1992, and Principal Emeritus from 1993-2000. Three scholarships of \$1000 are awarded annually, one each in May, July, and December to each semester's top 4U graduate in Social Science.

In memory of Sylvia Park, a graduate of Columbia International College, whose courage and determination throughout her battle with leukemia were an inspiration to all. Three scholarships of \$500 each are awarded in December, May, and July to a graduating student who is an Ontario scholar and who demonstrated leadership through Student Council, Columbia Crew, Prefect System, or any co-curricular activity at Columbia.

#### Durwood Jones Barkwell Chartered Accountant Award

In memory of Mrs. Rita Bosas, a long-serving teacher and ESL Department Head, \$200 is awarded each 9-week semester to the continuing ESL student who has shown the greatest improvement due to academic support.

#### Kevin Matthews Memorial Scholarship

#### **Global Citizen Award**

The Global Citizen award is designed to recognize students' current experience and knowledge of citizenship at the school level. Three scholarships of \$1000 will be awarded, one each in December, May, and June, to the graduate who has demonstrated the wisdom to respect and strive to understand people of different cultures and grow from their encounters with them, the compassion to care for all, and the courage to act and make a difference.

#### **Fine Arts Award**

Three awards of \$500 each awarded annually, one each in December, May and June to each semester's top 4U/M graduate who has demonstrated excellence in the fine arts.



#### Internal Community Service Award

Three scholarships of \$500 will be awarded one each in December, May and June to a student who has demonstrated a commitment to making the CIC community a better place for other students through their volunteer work in various projects, departments and initiatives.

#### **External Community Service Award**

Three scholarships of \$500 will be awarded one each in December, May and June to a student who has demonstrated a commitment to community service to the greater Hamilton Community.

#### Young ASEP Achievers Scholarship of Excellence

Three scholarships of \$500 will be awarded; one each in December, May and June to graduating YAA students who demonstrate good Character, high academic achievement and commitment to the YAA programming. These students demonstrated significant involvement in the Columbia community with respect to athletics, clubs, community service and leadership. Recipients must complete one full year of the YAA program.



#### Athletics Award

#### Student Council Award

Awarded annually to any student who has made a significant contribution to school life. The student council advisors choose the recipient.


